"mudboy" is a performance, installation, video, and recording project that began at Fort Thunder in Providence, RI in the early 2000s. mudboy performed throughout the United States and Europe on homemade and experimental electronic keyboards with the occasional foray into adapted pipe organs. Accompanied by controlled lighting, surround-sound speakers, firecrackers, and smoke, mudboy's was a self-proclaimed "spell caster," exploring fantasy, power, control, and the uncanny through a guided musical experience. Though mudboy released nearly two dozen albums and "kits," and mounted four solo exhibitions, the vast majority of the nearly pitch-black performances were unrecorded and un-photographed. mudboy has performed alongside acts like Black Dice, Lightning Bolt, Paper Rad, Fenez, and Lucky Dragons, and created the worlds largest electroacoustic instrument for ISEA 2010 in Dortmund, Germany. www.mudboymusic.com
